

GHEiS Checklist

This Global Health Education in Schools (GHEiS) Checklist has been developed by Students for Global Health (SfGH) to complement the GHEiS Toolkit and to further help branches in the planning of their GHEiS programmes.

Programme Design

We formed a committee to organise the programme	
We choose our audience (e.g secondary school, primary school)	
We set two or three programme aims for participants, teachers and organisers	
We choose appropriate topics for sessions	
We considered collaborations (societies, local groups etc.)	
We set three or four learning objectives for each planned session	
We planned the structure of each session (activities etc.)	
We developed a lesson plan for each session	
We contacted the local Child Protection or Safeguarding team	
We planned GHEiS training	

Programme Organisation

We contacted schools in our local area	
We discussed timings of the programme (time of year, session duration etc.)	
We discussed the venue and teaching materials (presentation, flip-charts, etc.)	
We discussed sessions with our collaborators	
We ensured that session organisers received Child Protection/Safeguarding Training	
We delivered GHEiS training	

Education and Advocacy

We have considered how our programme could be used as a platform for a campaign or action in our local area	
We considered how our programme could widen access to higher education in our local area	

Feedback and Follow-Up

We designed feedback for our programme participants and teachers	
We followed-up with your participants and teachers to collect feedback	
We shared our feedback with the Global Health Education Director (see below)	

Moving Forward

We considered if we want to repeat the GHEiS programme	
We used the feedback collected to develop recommendations for future programmes	
We designed and delivered a comprehensive handover to the next committee
